- A good mixture of students
 - Annual intake: 2,000 (local) and 400 (non-local): about 80% and 20%
- Year-round exchange and virtual exchange
 - Exchange in and out: 1,000 students each way
- Programs
 - External accredited, periodic external reviewed, international benchmarked
- Are we truly internationalized?
 - Plenty of opportunity, but time to assess the results and effects

Expectation	More international than expected	Academics matched expectation No expectation re internationalisation	Expected very international but feel it is not
Inclusiveness	Don't feel excluded Language can be an issue for inclusiveness	Feel excluded in and outside classroom due to language	

- Students do not mix well in and outside the classroom
